This exhibit will run from approximately the first of November 2024 till sometime in May 2025. Jobs in the club have included 50-50, and Secretary. Besides Mustangs we enjoy kayaking, motorboating and all types of travel and adventures. Our first Mustang was a 1995 red convertible that was too good of a deal to pass up at Montrose Ford. Next was a white 2001 convertible, then a red 2005 convertible with red interior. After that was our black 2007 Shelby GT #3040 (the one you wished you hadn't sold!), that took us to at least 28 states. The next Mustang was a vintage car. We combined a trip to Myrtle Beach for Mustang Week with a visit to Florida to pick up a beautiful 1968 Cali Special big block 4 speed, black with red interior that is now living in Malta. Next car was the 2011 glass roof MCA edition. At one point we owned 4 Mustangs but are now down to just one, our Competition Orange 2015 GT Convertible.

We joined the NEOMC in the summer of 2008 and soon started traveling to Mustang events. The most epic trip was the 2009 Mustangs Across America. The drive began at Shelby Headquarters in Las Vegas going across the country with several hundred Mustangs ending at the Mustang 45th at Birmingham, Al. Our Mustangs have also taken us to the Tail Of The Dragon in NC, the Blue Ridge Pkwy, the Mustang 50th in Charlotte and to Sturgis Mustang Week. Several Myrtle Beach Mustang Weeks, lots of trips to Woodward Dream Cruise and then 15 years later back to Birmingham for the 60th Mustang Anniversary.

Our Mustang journey has been tons of fun and we are thankful for all the great people we have met and continue to meet.
