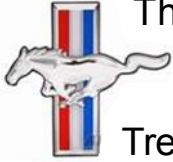

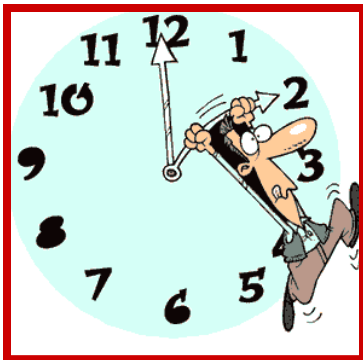
Happy St.Patrick's Day !
